

ASSURANCE OF TRIBAL AND PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT IN THE EDUCATION OF CHILDREN RESIDING ON INDIAN LANDS

- I. The Board of School Trustees of the Clark County School District recognizes that it has an obligation to ensure the participation of Native American Indian parents and tribes in the education process. It shall be the policy of the District, therefore, to disseminate pertinent information on applications, evaluation, and program plans to tribes and to parents of Native American Indian children.
- II. Through the regular school program and supplemental programs, tribes and parents of children residing on Indian lands shall have the opportunity to:
 - A. Present their views on applications, on the educational program and its operation, and on the degree of parental involvement allowed.
 - B. Make recommendations concerning the needs of their children and the ways through which they may assist their children in realizing the benefits to be derived from the education programs.
 - C. Consult with District personnel and become actively engaged in the planning and development of the programs.
- III. Similar opportunities for involvement shall be available for parents of all children attending District schools. Native American Indian children shall participate in school programs on an equal basis with all other children.
- IV. The Student Support Services Division shall be responsible for the development and implementation of procedures consistent with this policy.
