| Deletion/ Addition | CHER EDUCATION COOPERATIVE DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAMS | |
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This program is designed to allow eligible students currently enrolled in the Clark County School District the opportunity to receive credit through those accredited institutions of higher education which have a formal agreement with the District. Dual credit (both high school and higher education) is to shall be awarded for any course the student takes in an institution of higher education which is not available in the high school attendance, and will apply toward graduation requirements of both institutions.

- Α. Students must be currently enrolled on campus in a minimum of one (1) Deletion/ Addition course in a District high school. Determination of student eligibility for summer school Early Studies Program courses will be previous semester attendance. Students (Grades 9-12) are eligible for dual enrollment courses unless otherwise noted in formal agreements with community colleges, state colleges, or universities.
- Deletion/ Students must have a minimum G.P.A. Grade Point Average of 2.5. and Β. Addition meet the requirements outlined in the formal agreement between the institution of higher education and the District.
- G. Deletion Maximum credit to be applied toward high school graduation requirements taken under any approved alternate is limited to six (6) credits.
 - 11. Procedures
- Deletion/ Α. Students wishing to enroll in the Early Studies Program a dual enrollment Addition course must meet with a high school counselor to update the four-year Deletion student academic plan, and should secure the required application and procedure forms from the high school counseling office.
- Deletion ₿. If the Early Studies Program course is a duplication of a course offered by the student's school of attendance, high school credit shall not be granted. However, a student would continue to earn university credit at the institution of higher education.
- Deletion In cases where the question of a duplication of a course cannot be C. resolved at the school level, the principal may submit it to the Curriculum Commission for resolution.

- <u>D.B.</u> When students have completed courses at the institution of higher education, <u>without formal agreements with the District.</u> they shall notify the high school registrar and present transcripts of their final grades. At the time, credit will be verified and granted by the high school.
- Addition/ III. <u>Granting of Credit</u> Restrictions

Addition/Beginning with the 2019-2020 school year, Sstudents who successfully complete
a higher education course, approved by the Clark County School District, of three
(3) credit hours will be granted up to one half (1/2) unit of high school credit in
alignment with the Secondary Course Identification Directory and the Curriculum
Commission as outlined in Regulation 6121, Instructional Program Design
Development.
