MINOR BEHAVIOR INCIDENTS

DEFINITION:

- Minor behavior incidents (MBIs) are **STAFF-MANAGED** behavior infractions that violate school or classroom rules, policies or procedures.
- Minor behavior incidents (MBIs) are to be addressed by ALL school personnel.
 - NOTE: Four (4) MBIs and corresponding CCSD MTSS Progressive Response Resolutions, (Levels 1-3), must be logged into the CCSD's MBIs Tracking System in Infinite Campus (IC) prior to writing a major behavior incident referral in Infinite Campus (IC).

*Schools may <u>not</u> use exclusionary discipline resolutions for this behavioral incident.

URGENT BEHAVIOR INCIDENTS

DEFINITION:

• Urgent behavior incidents are **administrative-managed** behavior infractions identified as mandatory expellable offenses including sexual assault, requiring **IMMEDIATE ADMINISTRATIVE NOTIFICATION**.

• NOTE 1: Check behavior incident definitions, CCSD MTSS Student Behavior Incident Decision Flowchart, CCSD MTSS Exclusionary Behavior Resolution Flowchart and CCSD MTSS Exclusionary Behavior Resolution Matrix for further clarification.

• NOTE 2: Elementary schools should consult with Education Services Division (ESD) immediately for all elementary students who commit any of the aforementioned offenses.

• NOTE 3: Schools should consult with Student Services Division (SSD) immediately for any students with an IEP/504 who commit any of the aforementioned offenses.
