Position Summary

This position provides districtwide leadership, supervision, and direction in all aspects of the District's principal and executive leadership administrator development program. Responsibilities will include designing and implementing professional learning for preservice, initial service, experienced principals and executive leadership administrators, administrative design teams, mentoring teams, and leadership coaches. Additionally, this position will supervise and ensure pathway alignment of the new administrator and teacher leader pipelines. The scope and responsibilities of this position ranges from working locally with all Clark County School District departments, divisions, and regions; state and national legislative committees and organizations, including higher education; and business and community partnerships. The person selected for this position is directly responsible to the Assistant Superintendent, Leadership and Professional Learning Division (LPLD), Academic Unit.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

The list of Essential Duties and Responsibilities is not exhaustive and may be supplemented.

- 1. Plans, develops, implements, supports, and provides leadership, supervision, and direction in all aspects of leadership development for principals and executive leadership administrators.
- 2. Identifies and enlists current administrators to serve on design teams, initial service mentoring teams, and coaching cadres.
- 3. Develops and implements a mentoring program for newly appointed principals and executive leadership administrators, including directing the work of the retired administrators who may serve as "Leadership Coaches."
- 4. Directs programs of assessment and research activities for principal and executive leadership administrator professional learning related to instructional leadership responsibilities and job/embedded operational skills.
- 5. Monitors and supports the design, implementation, and professional learning alignment of teacher leader and entry-level administrator pipeline programs.
- 6. Monitors state and national issues and trends related to school leadership.
- 7. Maintains articulation and alignment of administrative professional learning with departments/divisions, as well as local, state, and national professional organizations.
- 8. Maintains effective and consistent communication with region administrators and site-based administrators related to District, state, and national initiatives.
- Provides input and support to division and region leadership regarding
 prioritization of professional learning needs, evaluation of professional learning
 for principals and executive leadership administrators, and reviews of current
 research.
- 10. Manages and monitors assigned budgets.
- 11. Provides assistance and current information to administrators regarding the implementation of federal, state, and local mandates, as well as District policies, regulations, procedures, and standards.
- 12. Organizes and oversees the work of an Aspiring School Principals Pool Design Team in developing and planning for pre-service, initial service, and experienced principals' and executive leadership administrators' professional learning programs.
- 13. Collaborates with the Grants Development and Administration (GDA) Department and the Academic Unit in seeking grant funding to support professional learning for principals and executive leadership administrators.
- 14. Identifies and develops appropriate professional learning for newly hired out-of-district principals and executive leadership administrators.

Position Expectations

- 1. Model exemplary leadership skills and concepts.
- 2. Demonstrate effective communication, collaboration, and interpersonal skills.
- 3. Demonstrate ability to multitask, manage multiple projects, and to meet deadlines.
- 4. Possess a strong knowledge of effective instruction including the Nevada Educator Performance Framework (NEPF); the supervision and evaluation of educators and administrators; alignment of curriculum, instruction, and assessment; lesson planning; and data analysis.
- 5. Possess a high level of self-confidence balanced with a servitude leadership approach, initiative, self-direction, and motivation.
- 6. Possess a strong attention to detail and quality.

Position Requirements

Education and Training

An earned master's degree from an accredited college or university.

Licenses and Certifications

Hold or be able to acquire, by time of appointment to the position, a Nevada administrative endorsement, as appropriate.

Experience

- 1. Have previously demonstrated at least five (5) years of successful licensed teaching experience in an accredited K-12 public or private school and be able to acquire, by time of appointment, a Nevada administrative endorsement; or, have previously demonstrated at least three (3) years of successful licensed teaching in an accredited K-12 public or private school and currently hold the a valid Nevada administrative endorsement.
- 2. Three (3) years' experience as a school principal in an accredited K-12 public or private school setting.
- 3. Successful performance in position held at time of application.

Preferred Qualifications
