Enroll in an Advanced Placement (AP) Course and take the AP Exam; earn a score of 3 or higher and possibly earn college credit.

► **Apply, get accepted and attend the Nevada university of your choice**

*Nevada System of Higher Education (NSHE) Admission Requirements (UNLV and UNR)*

- 3.00 GPA (weighted or unweighted) in the core curriculum or a combined score from the SAT Critical Reading and SAT Math sections of at least 1040 or an ACT composite score of at least 22 or a Nevada Advanced High School Diploma
- Approved NSHE Core Curriculum (4 English, 3 Math-including Algebra II, 3 Natural Science, 3 Social Science & History = 13 units) – see your counselor for a list of core classes

► **Reach your goals without Remediation**

*Be admitted to the Nevada university of your choice without remediation/contact Nevada institutions for specific course placement\**

**To be placed into a college level English class**

- SAT critical reading score of at least 440, or
- Act English score of at least 18

**To be placed into a college level Math class**

- SAT Math score of at least 500, or
- ACT Math score of at least 22

Juniors are recommended to begin taking these tests in January of the 11th grade year and continue to test in the senior year.

► **Acquire the Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship**

*Qualify for scholarship money to put toward your Nevada education*

- Graduate with a diploma from a Nevada public or private high school;
- 3.25 cumulative GPA (weighted or unweighted) in all high school credit granting courses, **and completion of the Millennium Core Curriculum**
- Approved Millennium Core Curriculum (4 English, 4 Math-including Algebra II, 3 Natural Science, 3 Social Science & History = 14 units) – see your counselor for a list of core classes
- Reside in Nevada for at least two of your high school years
