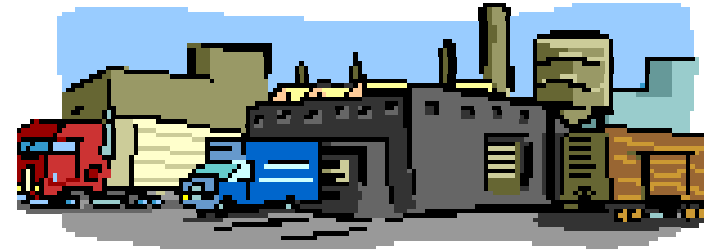

MAINTENANCE DEPT. TOP 10 WORK COMP INJURY CAUSES IN 2010

1. ERGONOMIC.....(TWISTING, LIFTING, PUSHING, PULLING, STRAIN, REPETITIVE MOTIONS, ETC)
15 - INJURIES
2. STRUCK OR BITTEN...(ANIMAL, INSECT, FALLING/FLYING OBJECT...) **9 - INJURIES**
3. SLIP & FALL ... (DIFFERENT LEVEL, SCAFFOLD, LADDER....) **7 - INJURIES**
4. NONE (NEAR MISSES OR FIRST AID ONLY)
6 - INJURIES
5. EXPOSURE TO ...(CHEMICALS, HOT OBJECTS, ELECTRICAL CURRENT...) **6 - INJURIES**

MAINTENANCE DEPT. TOP 10 WORK COMP INJURY CAUSES IN 2010

6. CUT PUNCTURE OR SCRAPE..... (OBJECT BEING LIFTED/HANDLED) **6 – INJURIES**
7. CAUGHT IN OR BETWEEN.....(OBJECT BEING HANDLED) **2 - INJURIES**
8. MOTOR VEHICLE.....(COLLISION OR SIDESWIPE WITH ANOTHER VEHICLE) **2 - INJURIES**
9. RUBBED OR ABRADED **1 - INJURY**
10. MISCELLANEOUS(FOREIGN MATTER IN EYES) **1 – INJURY**

ARE MOST ACCIDENTS PREVENTABLE?



ACCIDENTS ARE:

- ANY UNPLANNED EVENT RESULTING IN PERSONAL INJURY AND/OR PROPERTY DAMAGE.
- THEY CAN BE MINOR REQUIRING ONLY FIRST AID OR JUST A NEAR MISS.
- THEY MAY RESULT IN PERMANENT, PARTIAL, OR TEMPORARY DISABILITY.
- OR DEATH!
(IT'S LIGHTS OUT BABY)!



ACCIDENT PREVENTION

- An effective prevention program requires complete support and cooperation of ALL employees--from top management to individual worker.
- Top management must develop a suitable safety policy. They must furnish a safe and healthful work place and set goals for production that includes safety.

ACCIDENT PREVENTION

- Management must get appropriate equipment and supplies and assign specific responsibilities at each level of authority.
- Management must hold each employee accountable for his/her actions.
- Management, the safety committee, and first-line supervisors must assume responsibility for the group and set up safe work procedures.

ACCIDENT PREVENTION

- Management, the safety committee and supervisors must conduct periodic inspections, safety meetings, training sessions, and investigations.
- They must keep accurate records of training, accidents, inspections, and of corrective actions eliminating unsafe acts and conditions.

ACCIDENT PREVENTION

- Each employee must develop a safety awareness and become familiar with safe work practices and procedures.
- The work rules and the hazards associated with each procedure should be familiar to each employee.
- All employees should possess an attitude towards safety and make working safely a habit.
