Department Overview

The Clark County School District provides a program of instruction for school-aged students who are unable to attend classes due to injury or illness. To qualify for homebound services a student must be, or anticipated to be, absent for fifteen consecutive school days or more. The fact that the student will be, or is anticipated to be, absent for an extended period must be substantiated by a licensed physician. To be eligible to receive homebound instruction the student must be enrolled in a public school within the Clark County School District and be under the care of a licensed physician (medical doctor, doctor of osteopathy, psychiatrist.) Homebound is not intended for students with brief absences of less than 15 consecutive school days. It is the expectation that students who are on homebound are not participating in either school or outside extra-curricular activities. Homebound is not meant to be the student's only provider of educational services for the long term.

Performance Measures

<u>Communication</u>: Homebound services communicate with families using a variety of methods, including, but not limited to telephone, email, myccsd.net postings, face-to-face meetings, and surveys.

<u>Consistency</u>: Homebound services provide consistency by ensuring that teachers have the proper licensure and access to curriculum and materials to meet the needs of all students.

<u>Customer Service</u>: Customer service will be evaluated by parents, students, and home school staff with the use of surveys. The information will be used by the department to improve services.

Department Services

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- Provide direct instruction to students enrolled in CCSD who are unable to attend their home school due to illness or injury.
- Provide services to both general education and special education students.
- Provide assistance to schools when determining what may be in the best of interest of a student who is unable to attend.
- Provide assistance to families to determine if additional services may be needed for their student with unique or new needs due to illness or injury.
- Provide students with laptops and wifi devices, as needed, to access their education while on homebound.
- Provide teachers with access to instructional materials when not available from the student's home school.
- Provide assistance to families who may be in need of long term home instruction for their student.
