

Dear Parent or Legal Guardian,

In an effort to effectively and professionally enforce Standard Student Attire (SSA), we wish to notify you and your child of the dress code standards and the consequences that are enforced when a student violates the SSA dress code. The following is a table of expectations and guidelines that should be followed by each student:

✓ Pants/shorts (finger tip length)	✓ Pants/shorts (finger tip length)
✓ Blue jeans (approved colors, sized to fit, no holes, frayed edges, or markings of any kind)	✓ Blue jeans (approved colors, sized to fit, no holes, frayed edges, or markings of any kind)
✓ Denim pants in approved colors and sized to fit	✓ Denim pants in approved colors and sized to fit
✓ Sweaters (in approved colors) worn over approved shirts	✓ Sweaters (in approved colors) worn over approved shirts
✓ Sweat shirts/sweat suits (plain or school logo only)	✓ Sweat shirts/sweat suits (plain or school logo only)
✓ Shirts (long or short-sleeved, logo free or school logo, with collar). Shirts must extend below waistline to avoid showing bare midriff.	✓ Shirts or blouses (long or short-sleeved, logo free or school logo, with collar). Shirts must extend below waistline to avoid showing bare midriff.
✓ No flip flops	✓ Skirts or skorts (finger tip length)
✓ Jackets with zippers okay.	✓ Jumpers/dresses (finger tip length)
✓ Collared shirt must be visible if sweater or sweatshirt is worn	✓ Collared shirt must be visible if sweater or sweatshirt is worn
	✓ No flip flops
	✓ Jackets with zippers okay.

The approved colors for Standard Student Attire are Red, Navy Blue, Khaki, and White. There should be no variations of the colors.

The consequences of violating the dress code are as follows:

- 1st Offense- Warning
- 2nd Offense- In-House Suspension (1 Day)
- 3rd Offense- Required Parent Conference
- 4th Offense- Temporary Removal from School (1 Day)
- 5th Offense- Temporary Removal from School (2 Days)
- 6th Offense- Suspension
