

CHAPARRAL'S DRESS CODE

Rules have been mandated to enforce the Board of School Trustees (Reg. 5131) Approved Dress and Appearance Policy that "students' dress, personal appearance, and conduct are required to be of such character as not to disrupt or detract from the educational environment of the school." The CCSD dress code:

1. Prohibits the wearing of hats or any type of headgear anywhere on campus except for designated school approved uniforms at authorized athletic practices or activities.
2. Requires the wearing of shirts or blouses appropriately buttoned in accord with the design of that shirt or blouse. The length must extend beyond the belt level.
3. Prohibits wearing transparent, see-through tops, bare midriff, strapless, low-cut clothing, clothing with slits, or tops and outfits that provide minimum coverage.
4. Requires that attire be hemmed or rolled up and at least fingertip length with arms extended. If shorts are worn, they must be hemmed and without fray.
5. Requires the wearing of shoes with soles. Slippers are not allowed.
6. Prohibits the wearing of spaghetti straps; all sleeveless shirts must have straps at least three inches wide and cover the shoulder. Chaparral requires men to wear a T-shirt underneath all sleeveless shirts.
7. Prohibits slogans or advertising on clothing which, by their controversial or obscene nature, disrupt the educational setting. This includes any clothing that advertises alcoholic beverages or drugs.
8. Prohibits the wearing of sunglasses within the perimeter of the school building unless medically required.
9. Prohibits the wearing of bandannas, gloves, chains, spike or studded bracelets, necklaces, earrings, and/or rings.
10. Athletic clothing must be worn in the manner in which it was designed to be worn; team logos or titles may not be altered.
11. Belts must be worn in the belt loops. The waistband of pants must be worn at the waistline; pants must not "sag." Pants with ultra-wide legs may not be worn.

Any student violating the dress code will not be allowed to attend class and may be placed on Required Parent Conference. The principal shall retain the authority to grant exceptions for special occasions.
