Board of School Trustees

CLARK COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT

1. The officers of the Board shall be a President, a Vice President, and a Clerk, elected as provided in [NRS 386.310](#). They shall be elected at the first meeting in January from among the Board members.
2. The term of office for all officers shall be for one year, from one organization meeting until the next organization meeting of the Board or until a successor is elected. No Board member may serve more than two successive terms in any one particular office.
3. The following procedure, utilized one office at a time will be used for selecting a member to serve for each office:
 - A. Nominations: Any Board member may nominate for any office (including the nomination of oneself)
 1. The order of nominations shall be President, Vice President, and Clerk.
 2. Nominations do not need to be seconded.
 3. A motion, a second, and a vote will close nominations for each office.
 - B. Voting: To be elected to an office, a nominee must receive four Aye votes.
 1. Each candidate for the Board officer position will be given three minutes to provide a brief statement on their own behalf. They may also choose to provide a written statement or documentation to outline their goals or individual skills and experiences that would be beneficial for the position they are seeking. Written documentation should be provided to the Board Office staff so it can be posted as reference material for the Board meeting in which the election of officers occurs.

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2. Candidates for an office shall be voted on using blind paper or electronic ballots. Each Trustee will be given a paper ballot, or access to an electronic ballot, to mark their individual preference. Ballots will be collected and tallied by Board Office staff; individual votes will be read into the record by Board Office staff. The first individual to receive a majority of votes is elected to the office and the voting ceases for that office.
3. In the event that three or more candidates seek the same office, the first individual to receive the majority vote is elected and the voting for that office is ended. If there is not a majority vote, then the next two candidates would be voted on.

If an office becomes vacant for any reason, the office shall be filled by an election for that office by the Board members in the same manner as outlined in the procedure for election of officers. The new election shall take place as soon as possible at a meeting following receipt of notice of the vacancy and in accordance with the Open Meeting Law. If the office of the President becomes vacant, the Vice President shall fill the vacancy until the election of a successor.

After appropriate notice, the Board may rescind the election of any officer if it so wishes. Rescinding the election of any office shall be used sparingly,

The only acceptable causes for rescinding the election of an officer are:

1. The officer fails to perform the duties and responsibilities outlined within their role, as noted in formally adopted policies, or
2. The officer consistently fails to follow formally adopted Board policies and/or behaves in a manner inconsistent with the expectations of GP-4.2 Board Members' Principles of Operation.

The officer must be given an opportunity to address their performance and/or behavior issues before rescinding their position.

To rescind the election of any officer, a request for consideration must be made at a regular board meeting during the portion of the agenda reserved for agenda requests. An item to consider the rescinding will be added to the following Board agenda to be voted on by the full Board, with a majority vote required for rescinding.
