TEEN SUICIDE CURRICULUM PRESENTATION

Mary Pike presented information regarding curriculum that CCSD purchased entitled "Signs of Suicide" and explained that the school district would be training staff and teachers.

Mrs. Pike shared the details of her powerpoint:

She cited leading suicide causes, student behavior, statistics and what schools can do to identify students in need of assistance and how to help them. She discussed the program and student goals. The message of "ACT" (Acknowledge – Care – Tell) was explained to the committee.

Mrs. Pike introduced Mr. Bob Weires of Psychological Services.

Mrs. Pike explained that CCSD has the highest rates in the United States for suicide. She said students could obtain additional handouts that were left from last week.
