Thank you for your participation in our April meeting with Joyce Haldeman. I know a lot of information was shared and that the handout will take some time to review, but all this work will pay off next November when we are successful in carrying out the building of 73 new schools and rehab of our older schools. Many of these older schools are in District G, and it is all important that we share our support with neighbors and family for the passage of this measure.

Our final 2007-08 PAC meeting will be held on **WEDNESDAY, MAY 7th at 9:15 A.M. IN THE EAST REGION MEETING ROOM.** I am sorry about this date change. I have a family commitment the next week. It was asked at our April meeting that we have District personnel talk about the changes to our High Schools through "small learning communities" and Freshman Academy. I have invited Dr. Brenda Larsen-Mitchell to share with us recent state legislation mandating changes to the high schools. We will also look at the effect on the other students in our high schools through the make up of these smaller learning communities. All of the high schools in District G are working on these changes with some variety in each program. The variety makes it possible to adapt to the needs of each high school and their students. I look forward to hearing your ideas and comments on this presentation.

I will continue to have a monthly Newsletter, with the exception of July, to help keep you updated as to the work of the district in continuing our efforts for student achievement for all students.

In April we also discussed the continued efforts to ensure that all our students, staff, and families are safe on our campuses. Eileen Brookman Elementary School will hold a School Violence Awareness presentation on May 1 from 6-8:00 p.m. **NO ONE UNDER THE AGE OF 18 IS PERMITTED TO ATTEND,** so please make arrangements for your younger children. The 2-hour presentation will cover numerous topics as they relate to the prevention of school violence. I hope to attend and encourage anyone interested to do so.

As time out of class approaches--of course year-round schools work at this all year long--I am sure you will find the means and resources to augment your child's education. This is the time for parents and families to support the learning that takes place in the classroom.
