Mission:

Kids About-*A Safety Coalition* is a community coalition formed to change the culture of poor driver behavior in school zones, along school walking/biking routes, and near school bus stops in Clark County by:

- Educating drivers to improve driving habits;
- Educating kids to instill safe walking and biking habits; and
- Creating a mutual respect between pedestrians and drivers.

Background:

During the 2005-06 school year, at least 36 documented accidents, three resulting in fatalities, were reported near Clark County School District campuses. Such staggering numbers prompted our community to join forces to reduce the traffic dangers our children face on their way to and from school. Several factors contributed to these accidents: poor driver habits, over crowded schools, road construction, limited crosswalk visibility and poor pedestrian habits.

Accomplishments:

Since December 2005, **Kids About** has developed or supported several initiatives to improve the safety of our children on their way to and from school. The following are just a few of our accomplishments:

- ➤ NRS 484.399 Change (20ft Parking Restriction at all Crosswalks) Signed into Law in 2007
- NRS 391.275 Change (Expanded School Police Jurisdiction)
 Signed into Law in 2007
- School Crosswalk Stencil Project

- NV Safe Routes to School Grant (\$185,688)

Goals:

During every school year, **Kids About** will attempt to raise awareness of traffic safety near our schools through media campaigns and educational programs. Principals and school parent groups will be encouraged to form traffic safety committees. These traffic safety committees will "proactively" work on making our routes to and from school safer for children utilizing the principles outlined in the Federal Highway Administration's Safe Routes to School Program.

Safety Message:

Please help us make this school year safer for our students.

- Slow down in school zones.
- Do not park close to school route crosswalks.
- Refrain from using cellular phones while driving near schools or school bus stops.
- Know the condition of the route your children take to and from school.

Do you know Nevada's traffic laws?

- No stopping or parking on crosswalks
- No parking within 20 feet of "all" crosswalks
- No backing up onto a crosswalk
- No parking on the sidewalks
- No parking within 15 feet of a fire hydrant
- No parking in the fire lane
- The speed limit on ALL CCSD campuses is 5 mph

Do you know your child's route to school?

Construction projects within school zones, on school routes or near school bus stops have a serious impact on the safety of our children. Lack of communication between developers, local governments, school staff and parents puts our children at risk every day.





Teach your children traffic safety.

- Cross within the crosswalks
- STOP, LôoK, and LISTEN for traffic
- LOOK LEFT, LOOK RIGHT and then LOOK LEFT again
- Always walk with a "buddy"
- Never talk to strangers on your way to and from school
- Walk bikes, scooters & skateboards in crosswalks
- See and be seen near high profile vehicles

Are your kids listening?

A child does not stand a chance against any vehicle no matter how invincible our kids believe they are. When crosswalks are provided, our kids need to be encouraged to use them. Drivers also need to learn patience and yield to pedestrians; it's the law!
