# CCSD Board of Trustees Community Meeting February 2

The CCSD Board of Trustees has scheduled a community meeting at Liberty High School on Thursday, February 2, 2017, at 6:00 p.m.

Jeremy Aguero, principal analyst with Applied Analysis will discuss property tax caps and abatements that could potentially impact the budget of the Clark County School District. Staff from Community and Government Relations will provide information on bill drafts submitted by the CCSD, as well as how the community can get involved during the 79th Legislative Session that begins on February 6, 2017.

### **English Language Learner Division**

Once the CCSD Board of Trustees approved the Master Plan for English Language Learner Success (ELL Master Plan) in May 2016, the English Language Learner Division (ELLD) sprung into action. A brief video outlining the major components of the ELL Master Plan was developed and delivered to schools in August 2016. To date, almost 14,000 educators from almost 300 schools have viewed the video.

Another component of the ELL Master Plan is the professional learning plan which describes how educators will engage in systemic change to the Academic Content and Language Achievement Model (ALCA-M). The professional learning plan, which rolls out to all CCSD schools over a five year period using a cohort group strategy, requires educators to attend 16 hours of professional learning on the Language Development Approach and Six Principles of Effective ELL Instruction each year for three years. The first cohort. Cohort A. includes 80 schools. mostly ZOOM, and Cohort B will include an additional 126 schools. While professional development surveys from Cohort A schools reveal session satisfaction upwards of 90%, shifting teachers' views from a deficitorientation to an asset orientation requires time. Generally, educators indicate an interest in learning how to meet the language development needs of ELLs.

Efforts to engage ELL families are also underway. The ELL Division developed University of Family Learning courses on ALCA-M and language development which have been attended by more than 200 parents and guardians. Additionally, work is in process to diversify instructional programs to meet the needs of newcomers and long-term ELLs. Finally, the newly-revised 2016-2017 ELL Technical Procedures Manual was recognized by the Nevada Department of Education with four commendations.

The Clark County School District (CCSD) budget staff typically prepare three cycles of budgets each year. In the spring is the tentative budget, followed by the final budget a month later, and amended final budget in late fall. Budget staff is currently gathering and analyzing information sources necessary to prepare a tentative budget for submission to the Board of School Trustees in April for consideration and approval. New to the process this year is the completion of strategic workbooks for all local school precincts. The workbooks were released to the individual precincts on January 17, 2017. This year is a legislative session for lawmakers. Various proposals will be introduced in the form of bills by the legislative members that may have potential impact on the budgeting process.

# **CCSD Celebrates Black History Month**

During the month of February, Clark County School District (CCSD) schools have celebrated Black History Month through a variety of activities ranging from studying prominent African-Americans to having events that include song, dance and poetry.

Many of the activities, like living museums, tie directly to the district's curriculum with the study of historical figures such as civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., artist Romare Bearden, abolitionist Harriet Tubman, activist Rosa Parks and the Tuskegee Airmen.

At Cimarron-Memorial High School, students will be reading a speech by Dr. King as an example of persuasive writing. They also will create a picture gallery to acknowledge African-America men and women who have impacted history. At Gibson Middle School, the science department will feature African Americans in science. Third-grade students at Craig Elementary School are reading about Harriet Tubman, Rosa Parks and Ruby Bridges, studying their achievements and contributions. At McWilliams Elementary School, fourth-grade students are reading about famous African Americans and will write reports on the subject.

Schools like Desert Oasis High School celebrated the arts and culture by bringing in local artists to perform dances and hold drum circles on their campus, while students at J.T. McWilliams Elementary School listened to cultural music by African-American musicians.

Kermit R. Booker Sr. Elementary School students were visited by motivational speaker and former NFL player Vernon Fox who shared his personal life experiences with students and encouraged them to do well in school. Fox is a native of Las Vegas and a graduate of Cimarron-Memorial High School.

In addition to the wide variety of activities at schools, the district highlighted some of its prominent African-American educators for their contributions to the district and the community. Among those featured on the district's website have been Dr. Claude Perkins, who became the district's first African-American superintendent in 1978 and is now the CEO of Virginia Union University.

The district also highlighted the contributions of namesake Eva G. Simmons, who started in the district in 1964 as a teacher. Simmons' 37-year CCSD career also included working as a principal, assistant personnel manager and area superintendent before being named as school namesake in 2001. Simmons continues to be active as a volunteer and mentor at the North Las Vegas school that bears her name.

While most of the events and activities were only open to students and parents, Bonanza High School will host its annual Black History Concert on Wednesday, February 17, from 6-8 p.m. A Soul Food Feast will follow the program. # Two CCSD Schools Recognized As National Title I Distinguished Schools

Two CCSD schools were named National Title I Distinguished Schools by the National Title I Association. Thompson Elementary School and Bracken STEAM Academy were recognized for their outstanding achievements. The National Title I Distinguished Schools Program is a project of the National Title I Association that publicly recognizes schools for their positive educational advances in one of three categories:

Category 1: Exceptional student performance for two consecutive years. Category 2: Closing the achievement gap between student group, and Category 3: Excellence in serving special populations of students (e.g. homelessness, migrant, English language learners, etc.)

Thompson Elementary School was recognized in Category 2, while Bracken STEAM Academy was honored in Category 3. These two CCSD schools were the only National Title I Distinguished Schools in Nevada to be recognized for their achievements in 2016. For more information, click here.

By partnering with the business community, CTE programs are investing in students and providing them with the latest technology and skills that will prepare them to become successful employees and future leaders.

Career and technical education programs in CCSD provide students with significant advantages in academic and career preparation, and strengthens our local economy by filling the skills gap. Data shows students who participate in CTE courses graduate from high school at a 13% higher rate in Nevada, move on to college and perform better on standardized tests.
