In this newsletter, I will update you on the superintendent search, report on zoning, and reflect on the Parkland Florida shooting.

I will begin with reflections on the Parkland Florida shooting. My heart goes out to all of the victims and survivors of this tragedy. For those who lost loved ones, this will forever change them and I know that their grief is intense and overwhelming. Time will ease the height and depth of this pain, but nothing will make up for the loss. Whatever your stance on gun control, there must be a resolution for the mentally ill having the ability to acquire assault type weapons. As I reflect on the situation, I do not believe the solution is putting guns into the hands of teachers. Teachers are supposed to educate. Communities must come together to address the needs of our young people. This is not a school issue, but rather it is a community issue. Poverty, isolation, low self-esteem, hunger and poor medical care are issues we should all be concerned about in our communities. I am heartened by the response of the young people in Parkland who choose to view this as an opportunity for change.

With regard to safety in our own district, the safety of our students and staff are of the utmost importance to the CCSD. The board will be bringing forward an item to discuss safety concerns in our district and what is being done to address them. That meeting is to be determined.

On February 21st, the board met with the Attendance Zone Advisory Commission, and approved all recommendations as presented. I am grateful to all members of AZAC for their dedication and commitment to sound and fair decisions regarding zoning for our students. I am especially grateful my representatives, Albert Delgado and Nicole Benson. Thank you, both, for all you do for students and the CCSD.

The superintendent search is open at this time and closes on March 15th. The search firm will then begin to vet the candidates and bring us the top qualifying persons for our consideration. At this time, the plan is for the board to conduct interviews of the finalists on April 12th. Community meetings will be held on April 13th and 14th where each candidate will present themselves to the community and members of the community will be able to ask questions. Times and locations have not yet been established for the community meetings. Tentatively, the board has set a meeting for April 18 to pick the next superintendent or to conduct further interviews.

Finance Department Update

Members of the Clark County School District (CCSD) budget staff continue in preparing the Tentative Budget for the upcoming 2019 fiscal year (FY) which starts on July 1, 2018. Budget Requests (BR) forms have been received by departments for any requested budget modifications. The BR list has been given to the Chief Financial Officer for analysis and discussion with the superintendent. Presentation of this budget to the Board of School Trustees is currently scheduled for the April 4th work session.

Several staff are beginning the training process in the new Human Capital Management system. Subject matter experts have been chosen from the Business and Finance unit to aid in the transition process of this very important conversion.

REMINDER: There is **no March F-TROOP Meeting** scheduled. My next meeting will be held Wednesday, April 11, 2018, 9:30am, at Kathy L. Batterman Elementary School. Required video training aims to help protect students and staff

Helping to protect Clark County School District (CCSD) students and employees is the intent of a series of training videos developed for employees, coaches, volunteers, parents and students. The videos are associated with Policy and Regulation 4100, which outlines acceptable relationships and communication between students, employees and coaches, including volunteers. CCSD has training videos for the following: Employees, coaches and volunteers; Parents; All CCSD students, and CCSD students sixth-grade and older

The videos that are specific to staff and parents discuss, among other things, the fingerprinting of volunteers who have regular or unsupervised contact with students, which is required by state law. Volunteers also must sign a form that acknowledges they are mandatory reporters in connection with child abuse.

All students, staff and coaches are required to watch the training video specific to their group by March 23, 2018. All videos are available at www.ccsd.net/protectourkids.

Poetry Out Loud

On February 6, the School-Community Partnership Program held the 13th Annual Poetry Out Loud National Recitation Competition at the West Charleston Library in partnership with the Nevada Arts Council, the National Endowment for the Arts and the Poetry Foundation. Poetry Out Loud is part of a national program that encourages high school students to learn about poetry through memorization, performance, and competition. Twelve students who were finalists from six Clark County School District high schools participated in the event. The winner received a \$250 prize and will advance to the Poetry Out Loud State Finals on March 3 in Reno, Nevada. The state champion will win \$200 and an all-expensepaid trip with one adult chaperone to the National Championship to be held in April in Washington, D.C., where \$50,000 in scholarships and school prizes will be awarded.
