The Clark County School District 2013-2014 district score card is now available online at http://www.ccsd.net/district/district-scorecard/. The score card includes six indicators of student success: Proficiency, Achievement Gaps, Graduation Rate, Engagement, Student Safety and College and Career Readiness. As we plan for the future, we would like to ensure that all Kindergarten classes are 23 students or smaller and expanded to full day, as well as see our ZOOM schools receive Early Childhood and Pre-K.

Seven new magnet programs will be added in the 2016-2017 school year including five select programs. The schools are: McCaw ES, Piggott ES, Guinn MS, Johnson JHS, White MS, Del Sol HS, Eldorado HS, Canyon Springs HS, and Desert Pines HS. We will be launching the new Family and Community Education Services (FACES) program in 2015-2016. Continued family involvement is an important issue affecting student achievement and we will be training schools on how to engage parents more effectively.

As many of you know, we will be moving from the Criteria Reference Test (CRT) to the Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC). There are practice tests available on-line at http://sbac.portal.airast.org/Practice-Test/ I challenge you and your family to do these rigorous tests. This provides an opportunity for your family to challenge each other for a CCSD version of, "Are you Smarter than a 5th Grader". You will be allowing your child to practice their computer skills that are necessary for completing this test while families will see the rigor that is expected of our students in a fun atmosphere.

Legislative Update

The Nevada Senate Republican Caucus has announced their leadership, including committee chairs. Senator Michael Roberson will serve as the Majority Leader during the 2015 Legislative Session. Other caucus leaders include: Sen. Ben Kieckhefer, R-Reno, as assistant leader; Sen. James Settlemeyer, R-Gardnerville, and Sen. Scott Hammond, R-Las Vegas, as co-whips; and Sen. Joe Hardy, R-Boulder City, as its nominee for President Pro Tempore of the Senate. Senator Becky Harris will chair the Committee on Education. The Assembly is still finalizing their leadership appointments as the state waits for the announcement of the next speaker.

Budget Update - Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR)

The Clark County School District (CCSD) Business and Finance Division recently finalized the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR), which includes an independent audit of the District's financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2014, by Kafoury, Armstrong & Co. The District received an unqualified audit opinion, meaning the financial records and statements were fairly and accurately presented and in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP).

In accordance with NRS 354.624, on October 30, 2014, the CAFR was submitted to the Clark County School District Board of Trustees and the appointed members of the Audit Advisory Committee. The NRS specifies the annual audit should be concluded and the report submitted to the Board of Trustees not later than four months after the close of the fiscal year for which the audit is conducted.

Further NRS direction indicates the opinion and findings of the auditor, if any, contained in the report of the audit must be presented at a meeting of the governing body held not more than 30 days after the report is submitted. The CAFR was formally presented to the Board of Trustees at a November 14, 2014, Joint Meeting with the Audit Advisory Committee. At the meeting, Kafoury staff presented the Independent Auditor's Reports, Government Auditing Standards Report, A-133 Report, Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards, and Auditor's Comments while the Chief Financial Officer, Jim McIntosh, presented the CAFR to the Board of Trustees for approval.

As part of the Joint Meeting, a brief presentation was provided to the Board of Trustees to explain major changes in assumptions from the Final Budget to the Amended Final Budget. The Amended Final Budget is scheduled for presentation to the Board of Trustees next month.

The CAFR season for fiscal year 2014 has officially closed, the Amended Final Budget is nearing completion, and budget development for fiscal year 2016 is in full swing.
