<u>Legislative Update</u> The Nevada's 77th Legislature concluded earlier this month at midnight on June 3rd only to resume in the 27th Special Session at 7:00 a.m. on June 4. The Legislature still had five key measures to consider in the waning hours of the 2013 session including bills on economic development, class size reduction reporting, the Millennium Scholarship, Clark County Scales and Use Tax Act of 2005 (More Cops), and a loan account for charter schools. These five bills were all voted on and passed in the early morning hours of the special session. You can view these bills at: http://www.leg.state.nv.us/Session/27th2013Special/Reports/.

Legislators passed a number of key bills benefitting education, here are just a few for your review:

 $\underline{\mathsf{AB288}}$ - eliminates the NHSPE and transitions to end of course exams for graduation.

<u>SB58</u> - allows all students to participate in distance education courses and eliminates certain barriers to enrollment.

<u>SB164</u> - changes the definition of bullying and provides for training of administrators and board members.

SB269 - requires proof of school attendance to receive a driver's license.

<u>SB407</u> - extends the time period for full implementation of the new teacher and school administrator evaluation system and providing for validation studies.

<u>SB504</u> - provides the first state allocation for English language learners in Nevada and creates Zoom schools that will have preschool, full-day kindergarten, summer school, and reading skills development programs.

<u>SB522</u> - allocates state funding to Nevada's school districts and provides \$200 per pupil in additional funds to CCSD.
