Graduate Advocate Initiative Program Recognition The Workforce Connections and United Way of Southern Nevada were recently recognized at the April 12, 2012, Board meeting for the implementation and support of the Graduate Advocate Initiative Program. With a partnership between the Clark County School District, Workforce Connections, United Way of Southern Nevada and the Nevada Public Education Foundation, the Graduate Advocate Initiative Program is helping to increase Southern Nevada's High School Graduation Rate.

Graduation Requirements Students in the Clark County School District must complete 22.5 units of approved course work, pass all portions of the Nevada High School Proficiency Examinations (NHSPE) and meet other District and state requirements. Below is information on the various types of diplomas graduating students can receive. Additional Information regarding graduation requirements and the types of diplomas can be found at the Nevada Department of Education, http://nde.doe.nv.gov/Resources_GradRequirements.htm.

<u>Types of Diplomas</u> Certificate of Attendance. This certificate is awarded to students who complete their course requirements, but do not pass all sections of the Proficiency Exams.

Standard Diploma. This diploma is given to students who earned four credits of English, three credits of math, two credits of science, two credits of physical education, one credit each of world history, US government, US history, and one-half credit of health and computers. The remaining courses are electives.

Advance Diploma. Students must earn 24 credits, including the requirements of the standard diploma, plus one additional credit in math, science, and arts/humanities or occupational education. Students must also achieve a minimum unweighted cumulative grade point average of 3.25.

Advance Honors Diploma. Students who receive this diploma are required to fulfill the 24 credit as the Advance Diploma stated above, and must complete the Honors, International Baccalaureate (IB), or Advance Placement (AP) courses required of the Honors Course Program. They must also achieve a minimum of a 3.25 unweighted GPA and 3.84 weighted GPA

<u>2013-2014 and 2014-2015 School Calendars.</u> The Board of Trustees recently approved the 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 school calendars. The calendars are available on the District's website at http://www.ccsd.net/district/calendar/.

Budget Update The Board of Trustees adopted the Tentative Budget for 2012-2013 at their April 11, 2012 work session and, as required by state law, authorized the Superintendent to submit it to the state Department of Taxation. This Tentative budget was built with the assumption that the District will have \$35.6 million less in resources (revenues and fund balance) than it had this year. Thus, additional budget cuts and/or employee concessions will be needed to balance the budget. The Board will meet again on May 16, 2012, at 5:00 pm, to adopt its Final Budget for 2012-2013, at which time more will likely be known about possible employee concessions.

<u>Legislative Update</u> The committee to study a New Method for Funding Public Schools met on April 20, 2012, to consider the proposals submitted by several consultants to conduct the study. Presentations were given by the American Institutes for Research; Augenblick, Palaich and Associates; Cross and Joftus; and Picus and Associates. After some deliberation, the committee chose the American Institutes for Research who will include staff members from both UNLV and UNR on their team to conduct the study.

The Legislative Committee on Education held its fourth meeting of the 2012 interim on April 26, 2012. The agenda included discussion items on the Nevada System of Higher Education, the Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship, a study on the relationship between eighth grade achievement test performance to high school graduation, the P-16 Council, Nevada's labor market, the College and Workforce Readiness definition, career and technical education, and early childhood programs.

<u>Policies</u> At the April 12 School Board meeting, the Board of Trustees adopted CCSD Policy 4110, Employment Discrimination, Harassment, and Sexual Harassment: All Employees. CCSD Releases 2012-2013 Budget Proposal

The Clark County School District (CCSD) submitted a tentative operating budget for the 2012-13 school year to the Board of School Trustees on April 11, 2012. Due to continuing economic uncertainty and pending the outcome of ongoing arbitration with the Clark County Education Association (CCEA), the tentative budget presents a balanced spending plan and a worst-case scenario outlook. CCSD is currently seeking to hold pay steady for the nearly 18,000 licensed personnel to cover a \$63 million shortfall. In an interview with KTNV-TV, Superintendent Dwight D. Jones said, "We understand it's a difficult budgeting time, but a win for us is to be able to save jobs." A second public hearing on the budget will take place at a regularly scheduled board meeting on May 16 to address any revisions. CCSD must submit a final budget to the Nevada Department of Taxation by June 8, 2012.
