#### CCSD Reports Preliminary Graduation Rate Increase of 2.6 Percent

The Clark County School District (CCSD) announced a preliminary graduation rate of 74.22 percent for the graduating Class of 2016. This cohort's graduation rate marks a growth of 15 percent in the last five years. "We are thrilled to see that our students continue to make gains and that our graduation rate continues to increase," said Chief Student Achievement Officer Dr. Mike Barton. The announcement took place Oct. 13 at Chaparral High School, which saw an estimated 14 percent increase. bringing their preliminary rate to 79.70 percent for the Class of 2016. Chaparral was one of five CCSD high schools that recorded an approximate increase of 10 percentage points or more. Graduating 17,491 students, the Class of 2016 is the district's largest graduating class with about 570 more students graduating than the Class of 2015, representing a 2.6 percent increase. #### Six CCSD Schools Names "Shining Stars" By Nevada Department of Education

Six CCSD schools are among 10 Nevada schools to be named to the Nevada Department of Education's inaugural Shining Stars List. Superintendent of Public Instruction Steve Canavero said, "Being included on the Shining Stars list recognizes and celebrates achievement at schools that have significantly outperformed the State in serving all students, with an emphasis on closing opportunity gaps." Schools recognized for being Shining Stars were either four- or five-star schools according to the Nevada School Performance Framework, serve a high percentage of students in poverty, and significantly outperformed the State average (top 10 percent) on the Smarter Balanced assessment, administered last spring. #### Schools Urged to Promote State Seal of Biliteracy

With an estimated 154 languages spoken in Clark County School District (CCSD) classrooms, there is no doubt that CCSD ranks extremely high in cultural diversity. One way this diversity is recognized is through the Nevada State Seal of Biliteracy, approved by the Nevada Legislature and implemented in CCSD in August 2015. Nevada is one of 25 states to have the Biliteracy Seal.

The Seal of Biliteracy is an award earned by students, recognizing their proficiency in English and at least one other language by the time they graduate from high school. Leading the charge to educate schools on this opportunity for students is Amanda Ruth, Coordinator of World Languages in the Instructional Design and Professional Learning Division of CCSD.

Ruth notes the difference between being bilingual and biliterate. "People can be bilingual and be able to speak a second language, but being biliterate means you have all four components. You can hear and understand, you can read and understand, you can write and you can speak."

The CCSD Class of 2016 produced 403 graduates who earned the Seal of Biliteracy. Ruth is hoping to double that number for the Class of 2017, and continue growing the number in years to come. "I want to make sure everyone knows what it is, why it's important and how students can obtain it."

Students show their proficiency in a second language through a language proficiency test. They can demonstrate proficiency through an advanced placement test offered by the College Board if taken prior to their senior year, or through an International Baccalaureate exam or a CCSD-approved test. They must also demonstrate their proficiency in English by meeting all the English Language Arts (ELA) graduation requirements.

The Seal of Biliteracy can be evidence of skills that are attractive to future employers and college admissions offices. Ruth has spoken with employers who have said they are more likely to hire a candidate who is biliterate

The bigger picture of biliteracy, according to Ruth, is that knowing a second language and the culture that it is connected to provides a better understanding of cultural diversity in our community and across the globe. "We need to make connections outside of Nevada. To do that, we need to be aware of other cultures, communicate effectively within those cultures and appreciate cultural diversity."

### What is International Baccalaureate (IB)?

International Baccalaureate is a non-profit foundation with a philosophy of international education that focuses on developing the intellectual, personal, social, and emotional skills of students. The IB continuum of education offers four challenging programs: Primary Years Program (PYP), Middle Years Program (MYP), Diploma Program (DP), and Career-related Program (CP).

IB programs encourage students to become active, caring, and lifelong learners who strive to make a difference in their own communities and in the world. IB students learn through the use of structured and guided inquiry connecting their learning to real life situations. IB students are challenged with a rigorous curriculum and framework of learning that includes world languages, arts, and design courses, in addition to core studies. IB students are encouraged to try different approaches to learning and to take responsibility for their own educational progress.

Research demonstrates that students in IB schools score as well or outperform their non-IB peers on international and state standardized assessments. Further research demonstrates that IB DP students are more likely to enroll in college and are better prepared for college coursework.

A school must go through a rigorous application and school candidacy process before it can be authorized as an IB World School. CCSD has eight authorized IB World Schools and four IB Candidate Schools\*:
