BEING AN UPSTANDER PRESENTATION

Brandon Moeller, Assistant Director of the Equity & Diversity Education Department gave a PowerPoint presentation and reviewed handouts regarding being an upstander and the school district's approach to bullying.

Some items that were discussed:

 - Teaching Tolerance: Bullying: Tips for Students

Students discussed the hashtag (#getyourblueon). Some comments:

- It is too long.
- The color blue can represent sadness.
- It has a sports connotation.

Students expressed a dislike for the name "Week of Respect" and felt it should have a more uplifting title.

Trustee Tew asked the students if they felt which approach, "be kind" or "anti-bullying," was more effective. Most students felt the positive approach would be better.

There was a discussion about being sarcastic and its ramifications on the receiving individual, even if he/she says "just kidding."

Mr. Moeller asked the students to send him any suggestions they may have for a new name for Week of Respect and/or new hashtag for Get Your Blue On. Those suggestions will be sent to Mrs. Ginger or Mrs. Plante.

Trustee Tew asked for a show of hands of how many members had witnessed bullying. About ³/₄ of the group raised their hands. She asked for a discussion about what students would do, i.e. go to website to make a report. A few students responded by saying talking to others is better than going on a website. A

student shared a story about how a counselor revealed information to all the teachers and she felt it was wrong to do so. Partnering with CTSO clubs was another recommendation.
