Public Comment on Items Not Listed as Action Items on the Agenda

James Bayliss provided the Board with a packet of information which he said contained the OJJ grant that he said attacked his family 13 times. He talked about the DOJ grant and how he and other parents have been attacked. He said his son is now behind and will not be able to graduate on time.

Angee Pompa said there is large time gap between the time a child receives a diagnosis of deaf or hard of hearing and the time their program begins at three years of age. She said she would like to figure out how to help those children during that time.

Tom Zumtobel provided an update on Teachers Health Trust (THT). He shared his email, tomzumtobel@ththealth.org, and said he is available to any educator that needs help.

Jim Frazee spoke about the lack of progress and the District's lack of urgency with regard to negotiations with the bargaining unit. He said the Clark County Education Association (CCEA) wanted to address issues in March and April and said the District was completely unprepared to have a discussion. He said if there is no contract in August, they are not waiting until December as in the previous years. He asked that a priority be placed on negotiations.

Michael Jahn stated that no one has had the credibility that CCEA had to help advance legislation during this past legislative session. He said he was embarrassed after the chair of the House Committee on Ways and Means remarked to Superintendent Jara, "You failed my children." He expressed frustration with how the District is handling contract negotiations and said CCEA is not waiting until November or December.

Trustee Williams acknowledged that people are frustrated, and she encouraged teachers and parents to email their respective Trustees, executive directors, and presidents and ask guestions.

Ernest Mackey said someone spoke to him after the last meeting, but there has not been anything done since then, and his children are still being harassed. He said he has not gotten any response, and this issue needs to be addressed.
