Inclement Weather Make Up Day -- The CCSD Board of School Trustees voted to designate Monday, April 22, 2019, as the make up day for instruction due to inclement weather in February.

CCSD's Five-Year Strategic Plan - Focus: 2024 Trustees voted unanimously to approve the strategic plan for CCSD, Focus: 2024, which outlines a plan to achieve the goals laid out by the Board of School Trustees for CCSD over the next five years.

These goals include:

- All CCSD schools will be rated three stars or higher on the Nevada School Performance Framework
- At least 90 percent of CCSD students will graduate from high school college and career ready

The Focus: 2024 strategy is based around the theory of action that "the only way we will transform our system and provide the educational experiences our students deserve is to recruit, support and retain the people who help us thrive," Superintendent Dr. Jesus F. Jara said. "Our people drive our success. In order to realize this plan, we must commit to attracting, growing, retaining and rewarding our people."

"Our core business is student success," Jara said. "This is why we all have jobs. We have jobs so that children can learn. We are intent on providing students with equity, accessibility and rigorous instruction, and we will hold ourselves accountable to meet our goals."

Legislative Session The Clark County School District's (CCSD) top priority in the 2019 Legislature is to stabilize its budget by modernizing the K-12 school funding formula and increasing the public dollars dedicated to, and staying with, K-12 education.

The funding priority highlights the Board of School Trustees 2019 legislative platform.

The School District's representatives in Carson City are advocating to increase the base funding formula to:

- Invest in our staff and students
- Fund professional development for teachers, administrators, along with research-based instructional materials aligned to the academic standards to provide high-quality, standardsbased instruction in every classroom.
- Ensure a safe learning environment

CCSD is also advocating for increases in funding to cover costs that CCSD must incur but are not fully addressed in the current education funding formula, such as employee increases, inflation, and hiring staff and purchasing materials for new schools when they open.

Upcoming School Year Online Registration

Online Registration for Clark County School District (CCSD) students for the 2019-20 school year will begin April 8. families with currently enrolled students can complete registration using Parent Portal via Infinite Campus (campusportal.ccsd.net).

Families new to CCSD may begin their registration process online via register.ccsd.net. Parents should note that the 2019-20 school year will begin on Monday, Aug. 12, 2019.

For families with students currently enrolled in the district, the process will take less than five minutes as information is prepopulated on the application for existing CCSD households to reduce the registration time and enhance the registration experience.

Schools will have computers available for parents to use for registration purposes. CCSD urges all parents to register and enroll their students by the first day of class, due to the funding methods used by the state of Nevada.
