CCSD Registration for 2020-21 School Year Now Open

Online registration for Clark County School District (CCSD) students for the 2020-21 school year is now open. Parents should note that the 2020-21 school year is scheduled to begin on Aug. 24, 2020. Families new to CCSD may begin their registration process online via register.ccsd.net.

Families with currently enrolled students can complete registration using Parent Portal via Infinite Campus (campusportal.ccsd.net). Parents or guardians who already have an Infinite Campus account will see an announcement through the Parent Portal and a link connecting them to the 2020-21 registration page.

New for this year, families will be able to review the CCSD K – 12 Student Code of Conduct. Families with multiple children will also see an option in certain areas to copy the responses from one child to the next, speeding up the process. Families can use a computer or a mobile device to complete registration.

CCSD urges all parents to register and enroll their students by the first day of class, due to the funding methods used by the state of Nevada.

It is important to complete the online registration as soon as possible so that each school site can complete their site-specific portion of enrollment and student schedules. The District is funded based on the average daily enrollment each quarter, therefore completing the process of registration and enrollment by the first day of school is essential.

Full-Time Distance Learning to Start the New School Year

On July 21, the Clark County School District Board of School Trustees unanimously approved the plan to start the 2020-2021 school year via a distance education model where students learn from home five days a week communicating with teachers daily.

Students will begin distance education classes on <u>Monday, August 24, 2020.</u> The Board will receive monthly updates on the data and trends related to COVID-19 cases in Nevada that will be used to determine when it is safe to return to classrooms.

The District is currently working on a parent/student guide that will be shared with you in the coming week to provide information on how teachers will communicate with students, and how parents can get access to resources and technology to support students during distance education. The guide will also be available online at ccsd.net. We will be sure to communicate with parents once that guide is available.

Additionally, community town hall meetings will be announced shortly to provide updates and answer questions from our parents, students and community members.

Parents can also pick up <u>academic resources</u> at CCSD food distribution sites. CCSD will also begin limited mobility food distribution at 10 additional school sites starting April 6 with various days and times.

CCSD Partners with Nevada Department of Education to Transformation Curriculum for Distance Education

The Clark County School District (CCSD) has partnered with the Nevada Department of Education (NDE) to lead the transformation of core curriculum into distance education resources that will benefit students throughout the state.

"Ensuring our students receive a high-level of education during distance education is crucial," said CCSD Superintendent Dr. Jesus F. Jara. "We are eager to share our resources with other districts throughout the State so more students have access to online curriculum."

NDE has procured licenses for the Canvas Learning Management System and Discovery Education content for all school districts in the state of Nevada.

CCSD Partners with Nevada Department of Education to Transformation Curriculum for Distance Education (continued)

Canvas is the primary learning platform CCSD will be using for distance education during the 2020-21 school year to manage online learning, and to connect teachers, students and parents to the digital tools they need.

CCSD will be sharing its Canvas course content with school districts statewide. There are more than two dozen courses already available or in the process of being converted for the upcoming school year. The first course offerings cover secondary curriculum, grades 6-12.
