Each year beginning on February 1, an entire month of events is planned nationwide honoring the history and contributions of African Americans. The theme for Black History Month in 2013 according to the Association for the Study of African American Life & History is **At the Crossroads of Freedom and Equality: the 1863 Emancipation Proclamation and the 1963 March on Washington**. In 1926, what we now call Black History Month was founded by Dr. Carter G. Woodson as Negro History Week. Dr. Woodson was the son of a slave, who later earned a doctorate degree from Harvard University. The second week of February was selected to coincide with the birthdays of Frederick Douglas and President Abraham Lincoln. In 1976, Negro History Week became Black History Month.

Jobs for America's Graduates (JAG) program

In its pilot year at Clark County School District (CCSD), Jobs for America's Graduates (JAG) provides dropout prevention, dropout recovery and schoolto-career strategies for students. The program assists juniors and seniors to stay on track to graduate and also provides support for young adults to pursue college or jobs with career advancement opportunities.

Chapter officers engage their peers in JAG's focus, coordinate program activities and track results. JAG participants gain access to community-based learning projects, field trips, guest speakers and job insights from potential employers. Teachers serve as JAG specialists, using program curriculum on employment-related competencies. A career association lists potential jobs and provides students with interviewing techniques. Since 1980, JAG state organizations and local affiliates have served more than 800,000 young people in helping to overcome major barriers to success.

Valley High School, Cimarron-Memorial High School and Bonanza High School also implemented JAG this year, along with three schools in northern Nevada.

46th Annual High School Photography Contest

The 46th Annual High School Photography Contest opens in February to all CCSD high school students. Since 1967, students have been able to enter the CCSD Photography Contest, the longest running student photo contest in Clark County. The contest opens doors for students by providing opportunity to show what lessons they have learned and giving them the opportunity to apply those lessons to a real life competition. Students fine tune their craft by focusing their skills, which will help build their resumes and portfolios. A call for entries is being made on February 18 and will run until April 5, 2013. Students will show their photographic talents, creativity and art in multiple entry categories and will be honored in an awards ceremony. Renovations Completed at Clark High School

Clark High School recently completed \$33 million in renovations and reopened its entire campus on January 7, 2013, for the first time in over a year. According to the <u>Las Vegas Review-Journal</u>, the school "replaced its heating and air-conditioning systems, installed energy-efficient lighting, replaced the kitchen, modernized classrooms with multimedia systems, replaced lockers, added wireless Internet school-wide, added new paint and carpet and more." The R-J said sections of the school were closed, and portables were used, while the renovations were under way.
