Legislative Update

CLARK COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT March 27, 2015

Highlights from Week 8:

Monday brought the second major deadline of the session: Committee Bill Introduction, resulting in another flurry of new bills. Now that the majority of the bills have been introduced, the next few weeks will be busy with hearings to meet the next deadline of passing the first committee by April 10.

Of the 998 bills introduced so far, we are tracking 266 – about 27% of the bills. When you get to the section of this report that shows the bills scheduled for hearings, you'll get a feel for the numerous hearings on bills related to education.

During the Governor's State of the State address, he announced a broad plan of education reform related to his vision of a "New Nevada." We created a chart (attached, "New Nevada Education Bills") to help us keep track of the bills related to his objectives. It may not be a complete list of initiatives, but we'll add to the list as we become aware of them.

Here's the day-by-day summary of the past week:

MONDAY, MARCH 23

Assembly Committee on Education

- AB218 This bill requires the Department of Education to coordinate emergency plans between school districts from across the state. The bill also requires that safety personnel meet once a year to share best practices on how to keep schools safe and how to handle emergencies as they are occurring. Moreover, the bill seeks a ratio of 250 counselors and social workers to every 1 student. This is a policy statement, a goal for the legislature to reach, and is not mandatory if the state doesn't fund a school at this level.
- AB221 on student data privacy is a bill, sponsored by Assemblyman Randy Kirner, that proposes to create a data dictionary at the state and local levels that must be published online to make parents aware of what data elements/categories are collected about their children. The bill also requires the district to include certain provisions in contracts that provide for the disclosure of data.

TUESDAY, MARCH 24

Senate Education

SB236, a bill sponsored by Senator Joyce Woodhouse, that extends the work of the STEM Council and provides for two events to recognize student work in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics was heard.

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 25

Senate Committee on Education

- AB351 clarifies which charter schools may qualify for the charter school facility loan money, which was created, and set-aside during the 2013 session. This bill would allow a charter school that has earned a 3 star rating to apply for these funds. Current law allows only those schools that are ranked 4 and 5 stars.
- ~ **AB 278**, sponsored by Assemblyman Elliot Anderson, requires the Department of Education to develop certain policies, procedures and guidance related to class-size reduction.
- AB285 was introduced by Assemblywoman Melissa Woodbury. This bill will allow diabetic students who have parent and physician permission to self-administer insulin while in school. The District submitted an amendment to the bill to require students to follow the school's procedures for medical waste.

- AB328, sponsored by Assemblyman Elliot Anderson, proposes to move due process hearings under the responsibility of the Department of Administration. The bill would also require hearing officers to reside in the county where the hearing takes place. The District is working with the sponsor to make some changes to ensure compliance with federal law.
- AB339, the bill that would provide a process by which school board members could be appointed, was introduced by Assemblyman Pat Hickey, along with State Superintendent Dale Erquiaga. A robust discussion followed, with both supporters and those opposed weighing in. Numerous school trustees from across the state testified in opposition, maintaining that elected school boards are more responsive to the public, among other things.

THURSDAY, MARCH 26

<u>Senate Committee on Education:</u> Two of the Governor's Education Reform bills were heard in the Senate Committee on Education on Thursday, **SB77** and **AB432**.

- SB77, submitted by the Department of Education, establishes "turnaround schools" in the Nevada Revised Statutes. The bill sets parameters for selecting turnaround schools, requirements for the schools, and deadlines to show improvement. The District has been working with the Department and is seeking some additional changes in the language.
- AB432 establishes the criteria and funding for Victory Schools, a program that serves students living in poverty. The bill requires schools identified by the Department of Education to submit plans for the funds allocated. Schools would be able to use funding for: prekindergarten, expansion of full-day kindergarten, summer academies, or other instruction for pupils, additional instruction or other learning opportunities when school is not in session, professional development for teachers and other educational personnel, programs to recruit and retain highly effective teachers and other educational personnel, evidence-based social, wrap-around services, parent engagement, programs to improve school climate and culture, and evidence-based academic programs.
- SB226 Heard by the Senate Committee on Education, this bill provides clarifying language that educator professional associations may provide professional development services. The bill would also allow these professional associations to apply for grant money should it be made available for professional development if Governor Sandoval's budget plan is passed.
- SB208 During the Work Session portion of the meeting, the Committee passed SB208, a bill that requires new charter schools to advertise to the surrounding community that it is open and is accepting applications for admission.

FRIDAY, MARCH 27

Assembly Committee on Education

AB448 was heard on Friday afternoon in a special meeting of Assembly Education. Another bill related to the Governor's reform package, this bill would create a new school district, the Achievement School District, to host low-performing schools with the goal of soliciting high-quality charter schools to come to Nevada to run the schools. Representatives of Nevada districts had lots of questions about the procedure, many of which were centered on the lack of local control and the implementation of requirements related to turning facilities over to non-district charters.

Senate Committee on Education

- SB390, a bill sponsored by Senator Becky Harris, that would allow students attending a traditional public school that is 25% over capacity or more to have priority if they wish to attend a charter school was heard
- SB338, a bill sponsored by Senator Debbie Smith was heard. The District testified in support of SB338, which would require the Attorney General to establish the Safe-to-Tell Program to enable the anonymous reporting of dangerous, violent or unlawful activity in or at a public school. Although Senator Smith was not able to be there in person, she provided input via telephone. She plans to return to Carson City and resume her official duties on April 8th. We continue to wish her the very best as she completes her medical treatments in Texas and look forward to having her back.
